

Arts Scholarships for Young People

Created and funded by the Arts Commission of Danville/Boyle County, the Arts Scholarship Program enables students, from kindergarten through high school, to participate in arts activities beyond what is offered in a school's curriculum.

Eligibility

To receive a scholarship award, not to exceed \$150, children must meet the following criteria:

1. live or attend school (including home schools) in Boyle County, Kentucky
2. have financial need
3. demonstrate interest in an arts activity.

Qualifying Activities

Examples of activities that qualify for an annual award from the Arts Scholarship Program include:

- private or class lessons in music, art, dance, or drama
- participation in a community arts organization, such as:
Heritage Area String Program
Arts for Kids, ETC
West T. Hill Community Theatre
- student out-of-pocket expenses associated with participation in a regional, state, or national competition or activity that is not funded by the school
- musical instrument rental

Acknowledgments

In accepting these funds, the arts organization or instructor agrees to acknowledge support provided by the Arts Commission of Danville/Boyle County in any printed material published by that organization or instructor for the duration of the child's participation and will provide copies of the publication to the Arts Commission. This acknowledgment should include the following statement:

Participation in this event was made possible by the Arts Commission of Danville/Boyle County through its Arts Scholarship Program.

Nominations

Applicants can be nominated by a teacher, parent/guardian or arts instructor. Awards are determined without regard to sex, race, religion, country of origin by an impartial group of members of the Arts Commission of Danville/Boyle County, and are authorized by its Board of Directors.
